The Adjective Phrase	
An adjective phrase is a prepositional phrase that acts as an adjective. The phrase modifies a noun or pronoun. An adjective phrase answers the questions what kind or which one. While adjectives usually come before the words they modify, adjective phrases usually come after.	
Adjectives	Adjective Phrases
The two-lane road was icy.	The road with two lanes was icy.
The rambunctious students got a lunch	The students in cycle 6 got a lunch detention.
An adjective phrase can modify various nouns or pronouns in a sentence.	
Modifying the subject of a sentence:	
The teacher in the cafeteria ate pizza.  The puppy at the pet store was adorable.	
Modifying a direct object of a sentence:	
**A direct object is a noun or pronoun receives the of the verb.	
The wind rattled the windows in the dining room.	
The teachers gave the students in cycle 6 a party!	

## Modifying an object of a preposition:

The weathervane on the roof of the barn spun wildly. Of the barn tells us which roof

The oranges on the table in the kitchen are sweet

"In the kitchen" tells

us which table

Modifying the same word:

The smell of rain in the air was noticeable.
