Adverb phrases modifying verbs:

- Raindrups feil in heavy tweents.
How did they fail? In heavy tweents.

- We traveled to Florida last year.
Traveled where? To Florida.

Adverb phrases modifying adjectives:

The day was warm for becomber . Warm in whatware? For becomber.

The movie was firmy for athriller. Funny in what way? For a thriller.

Adverb phrases modifying other adverbs:
The class-ended suddenly within minutes of the Suddenly to what extent? Within minutes
The shdents fied quickly down the hall
Filed quickly where? Down the hall
Other important points:
Adverb phrases, unlike adjective phrases, are not always located near the words they modify in a sentence.
